Trevor Hutchins (Nunawading & BHRDCA) – 1960 to 1998

BHRDCA President from 1992-93 to 1997-98, Trevor Hutchins is equally well known for his epic 238 not out in the 1976-77 'A Grade' Grand Final for Nunawading. In all, Trevor made 6111 runs and took 398 wickets for Nunawading from 194 games and is recorded as one the greats of the BHRDCA.

Trevor first played senior cricket at Blackburn in 1960-61, where his father Ernie was President and Life Member. By 1964-65, Trevor was in their first XI and won the bowling award that season.

Trevor then played for five seasons at Richmond, where he played eight games with their first XI.

Trevor joined Nunawading in 1969-70 and was appointed captain-coach in 1970-71. In his twenty seasons with Nunawading, Trevor was captain-coach for seven seasons and won the club champion on six occasions – which would have been more, had he not been deemed ineligible as club coach!

Trevor won the Nunawading batting award seven times and the bowling award five times with best figures of 7-28.

Trevor played in four 'Shield Grade' premierships with Nunawading and was captain in 1976-77 and 1981-82.

Trevor was awarded Life Membership of the BHRDCA in 1999.
