

Angus Falla (St. Peter's & BHRDCA) – 1948 to 1977

Angus Falla played a major role in building junior cricket within the BHRDCA to what it is today. The association commenced the first dedicated Under 16 competition in metropolitan Melbourne at the start of 1948-49 and through the efforts of Fred Clarke and Angus the competition slowly grew over the next twenty years. Angus is recognised as the BHRDCA Junior Section Manager from 1948-49 to 1966-67, and then from 1971-72 to 1976-77.

The first on-field reference to Angus can be found playing for St. Peter's second XI in 1952-53. By 1955-56, Angus was playing in St. Peter's first XI as an opening batsman and he was a member of the St. Peter's 'B Grade' premiership win over Nunawading in that season.

His two best seasons found were 1961-62 where he made 354 runs in 'A Grade', and in 1964-65 when he dropped down to 'D Grade' and made 491 runs including scores of 148 not out and 101.

Up to the end of the 1964-65 season Angus would have played approximately 140 games for St. Peter's and continued playing for the club for some years afterwards.

Angus was instrumental in the merger between the St. Peter's and Box Hill North junior cricket clubs with the new entity adopting the name Box Hill North from 1968-69.
